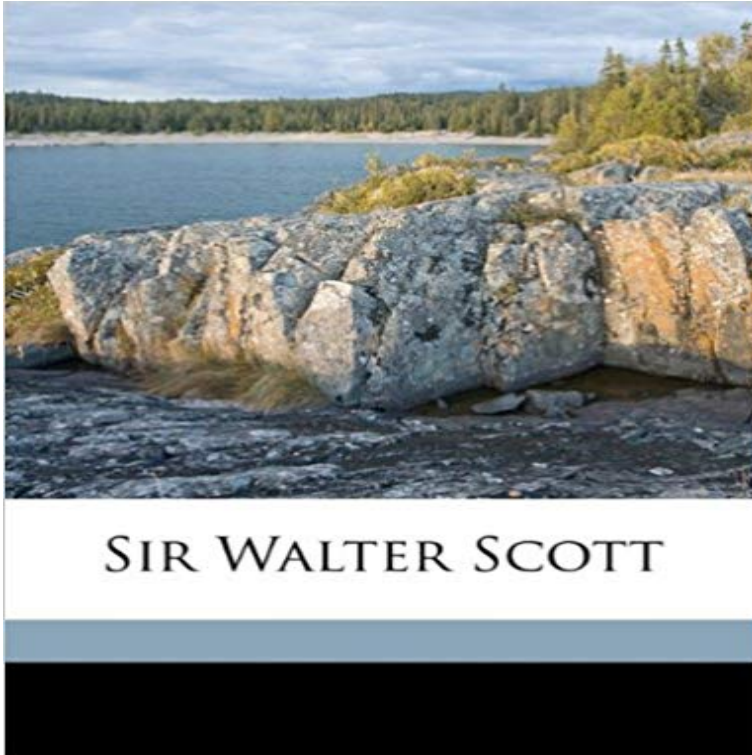


Sir Walter Scott
